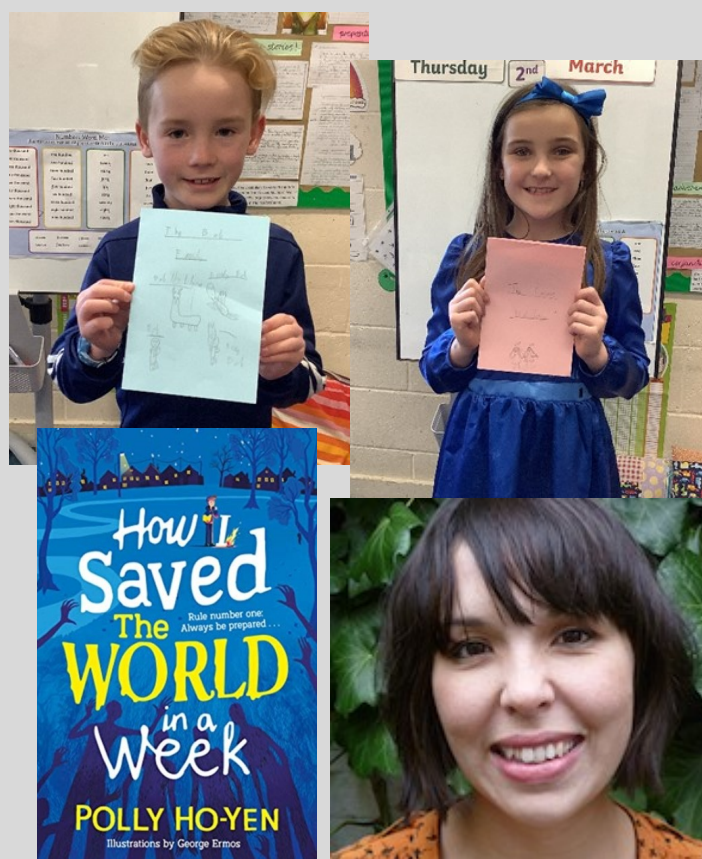


POLLY HO YEN AUTHOR VISIT

Fun Whale Facts!

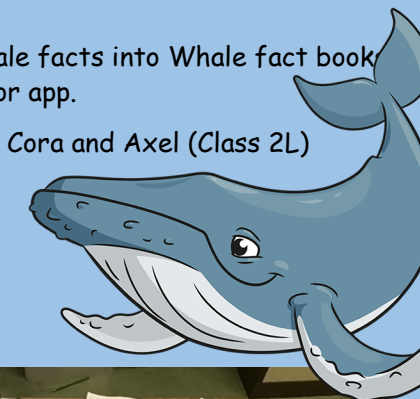
Year 2 have been learning all about whales. Here are some facts about whales for you:

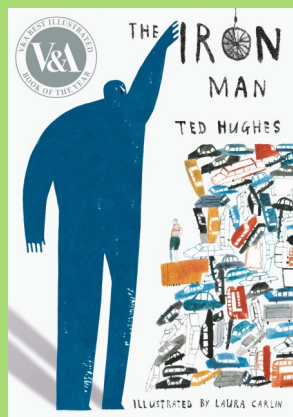
