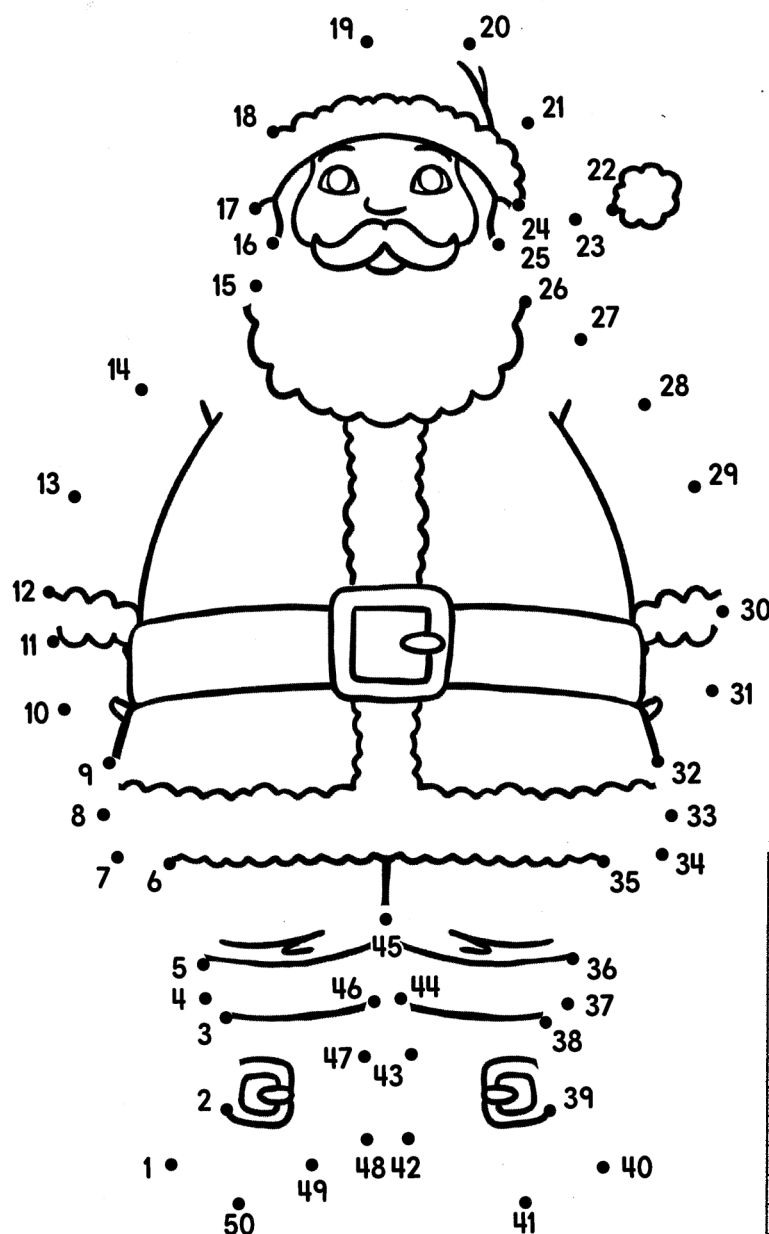


Father Christmas Dot to Dot

Evie G in 6R said that she really enjoys the book and she can't wait for Miss R to finish it. It is full of emotion, drama and adventure—with some great action thrown in too!

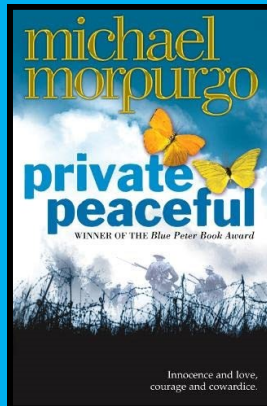
What would we rate it?

SANTA CLAUSE COOKIE RECIPE

COOKIE

INGREDIENTS:

[360G] ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR, PLUS MORE FOR ROLLING

1 TSP BAKING POWDER

1/2 TSP KOSHER SALT

[TWO STICKS] UNSALTED BUTTER, SOFTENED

[200G] GRANULATED SUGAR

1 LARGE EGG

1 TBSP WHOLE MILK

1 TSP

PURE VANILLA EXTRACT

BUTTERCREAM FROSTING:

[2 STICKS] UNSALTED BUTTER, SOFTENED

[570G] POWDERED SUGAR

1/4C WHOLE MILK

1/2 TSP PURE VANILLA EXTRACT

1/4 TSP KOSHER SALT

RED FOOD COLORING, RED SANDING SUGAR, AND RED AND BROWN MINI M&M, FOR DECORATING



DIRECTIONS: COOKIES

STEP 1: IN A LARGE BOWL, WHISK FLOUR, BAKING POWDER, AND SALT. IN ANOTHER LARGE BOWL, USING AN ELECTRIC MIXER ON MEDIUM-HIGH SPEED, BEAT BUTTER AND GRANULATED SUGAR UNTIL FLUFFY AND PALE IN COLOUR, ABOUT 2 MINUTES. ADD EGG, MILK, AND VANILLA AND BEAT ON MEDIUM SPEED UNTIL COMBINED. GRADUALLY ADD DRY INGREDIENTS AND BEAT UNTIL COMBINED

STEP 2: DIVIDE DOUGH IN HALF AND PLACE 1 HALF BETWEEN TWO PIECES OF LIGHTLY FLOURED PARCHMENT. ROLL TO A SCANT ABOUT 1/4" THICK ROUND. TRANSFER TO A LARGE BAKING SHEET. REPEAT WITH REMAINING DOUGH. REFRIGERATE UNTIL FIRM, ABOUT 30 MINS.

STEP 3. PREHEAT OVEN TO 350* AND LINE 2 LARGE BAKING SHEETS WITH PARCHMENT PAPER .

STEP 4. CUT OUT SHAPES OF DOUGH WITH 4 1/2" SANTA SHAPED COOKIE CUTTER. TRANSFER TO PREPARED BAKING SHEETS, SPACING 1" APART. FREEZE FIVE MINUTES.

STEP 5. BAKE COOKIES TILL EDGES ARE LIGHTLY GOLDEN, EIGHT TO TEN MINUTES. LET COOL COMPLETELY.

DIRECTIONS: FROSTING AND ASSEMBLY

STEP 1. IN A LARGE BOWL, USING ELECTRIC MIXER ON MEDIUM SPEED, BEAT BUTTER UNTIL CREAMY, 1 TO 2 MINS. ADD POWDERED SUGAR AND BEAT ON LOW SPEED UNTIL SMOOTH. ADD MILK, VANILLA, AND SALT AND BEAT UNTIL WELL COMBINED.

STEP 2. TRANSFER 2/3 OF BUTTER CREAM TO A PIPING BAG OR A RESEALABLE PLASTIC BAG, FITTED WITH A SMALL STAR TIP. WISK A FEW DROPS OF RED FOOD COLOURING INTO REMAINING BUTTER CREAM

STEP 3. USING A SMALL OFFSET SPATULA, SPREAD RED BUTTER CREAM OVER TOPS OF COOKIES TO CREATE THE HAT. DIP INTO SANDING SUGAR, PRESSING TO SMOOTH AND ADHERE.

Malala Fact Files

In year 5 we have been learning about Malala Yousafzai! Here is one of our fact files about her:



Who is she?

Malala was born on July 12th 1997 and grew up in Mingora (Pakistan). She is known for fighting for the right of girls education and equal learning for children. She lived with her 2 brothers (Atal and Khushal) and her mum (Tor Pekai) and her dad (Ziauddin). Her dad owned a school for girls and Malala had inherited her father's love for learning, therefore she loved each and every moment of school. She learned lots of languages and whilst her friends drew pretty flowers on their hands with henna, Malala was clever so she liked to cover her hands and arms in detailed science formulas. Unfortunately, where Malala and her family lived there wasn't as many opportunities for girls as there were for boys. Near her house was a rubbish dump where she worked (and the smell sometimes drifted through the open windows).

The Taliban

Without warning, the Taliban—an evil, dangerous group of men—took control of the land which Malala lived on. They banned: TV, music and dancing!

When this happened, they went further and made all girls and women wear burqas to cover their faces and girls were completely banned from school. Malala didn't agree and she thought it was disgraceful behaviour. Malala was courageous and decided to stand up for girls education and her dad supported her and encouraged her to keep learning and making the right choices. She was resilient and didn't give up fighting.

Writing for the BBC

On January 3rd 2009, Malala began blogging for the BBC (she used the pen name Gul Makai). They wanted a young girl to talk about their current situation. Bravely, Malala stepped up and volunteered to do it.. She was able to speak up in public and talk about her story.

War broke out

In May 2009, Malala and all her family and friends were forced to leave Swat Valley and Malala was mightily upset to leave her exercise books behind. The Pakistani army—a fearless bunch of men—defeated the Taliban and everyone was allowed back into the Swat Valley. Happily, Malala and her friends were able to go back to school and carry on learning. The army made the Taliban retreat.

Fun fact: once Malala said, "When the whole world is silent, even one voice becomes powerful!"
