In Year 1 we have been learning about the circus. We have learnt that if you want to be a clown, your face needs to be registered so nobody can copy it and have the same face paint!

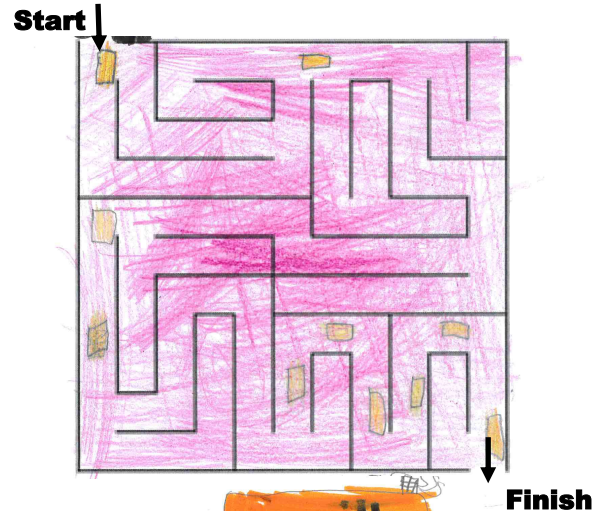
We are going to make our own clown registry with eggs. So far we have drawn a design in our books and soon we are going to make and decorate them.

Soon they'll be on display so look out for them in the corridor!

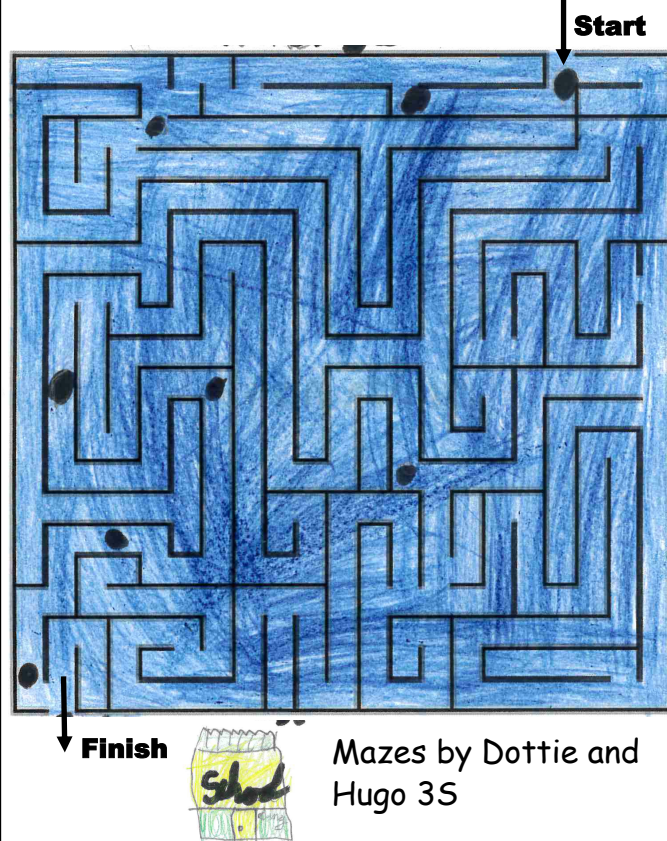

Chocolate Cherry Cookie Recipe

Makes 24 cookies

Ingredients:

75g butter softened
75g caster sugar
75g soft light brown sugar
1 medium egg
1 teaspoon vanilla essence
175g plain flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon baking powder
50g dried cherries
100g milk or plain chocolate drops

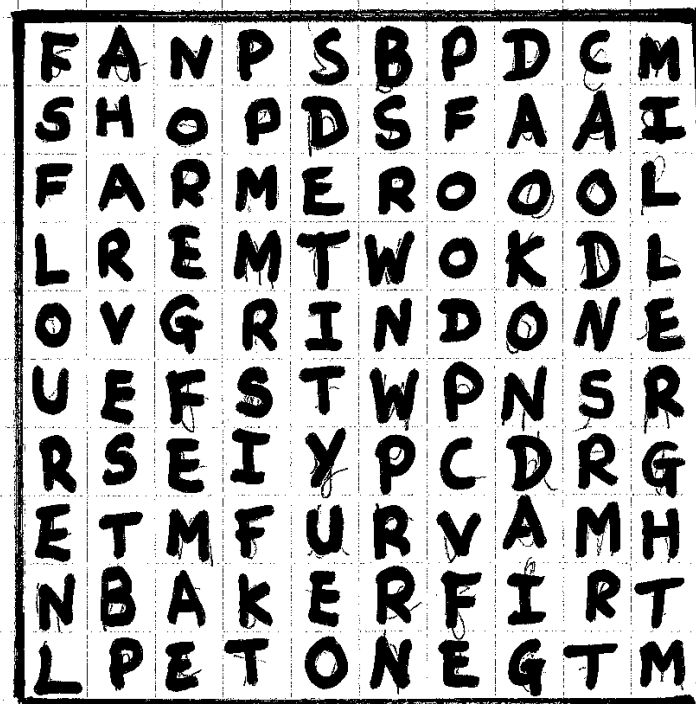


Instructions:

1. Heat the oven to 180C, 350F, gas mark 4. Wipe a little oil over two baking trays. Put the butter and both sugars in a large bowl.
2. Stir the butter and sugar with a wooden spoon until the mixture is smooth and creamy. Break the egg into a small bowl.
3. Beat the egg with a fork, then stir in the vanilla essence. Add the eggy mixture to the large bowl, a little at a time.
4. Sift the flour and baking powder into the bowl. Stir the mixture until it is smooth. Cut the cherries in half and add them.
5. Add 50g of the chocolate drops to the mixture and stir them in. Put a heaped teaspoon of the mixture onto one tray.
6. Use the rest of the mixture to make more cookies. Flatten each one with the back of a fork. Sprinkle on more chocolate.
7. Bake the cookies for ten minutes. Leave them on the trays for a few minutes. Use a spatula to lift them onto a wire rack to cool.

Book review

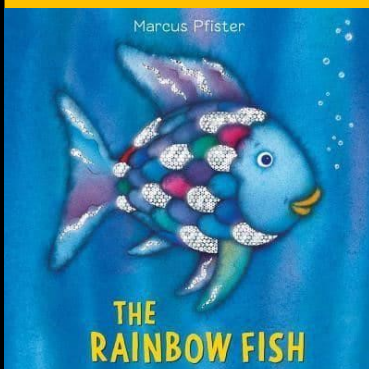
A book review by Maya in 1H
