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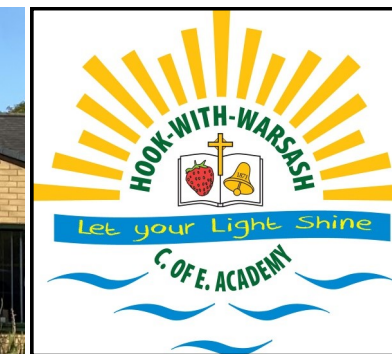


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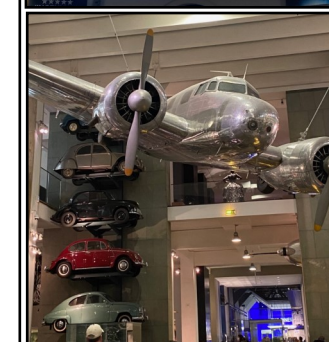
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MATILDA!!!

They’ve both done incredibly well so far, not only completing about 120 miles of various forms of movement (skate boarding, pogo sticking, swimming, guinea pig walking, netball shooting, cycling, dog walking, foot-ball-dribbling to name a few), but also getting loads of friends involved, and raising over £2000! Meanwhile, their cousin is incredibly poorly post bone marrow transplant. 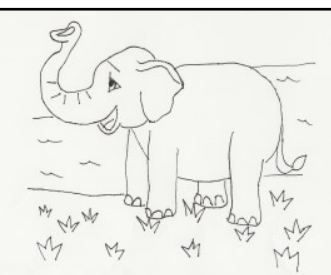
As part of our Easter work we also created our own paper plate cross designs in Art using colours which showed our feelings at different parts of

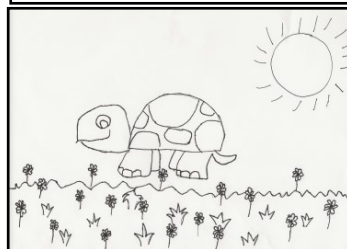
We think Whales are Wonderful! By Hugo and Dottie 2H

On the 4th March 2022 Year 4 started swimming at Holly Hill Leisure Centre. We really enjoyed swimming there and lots of us already have lessons outside of

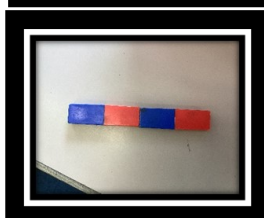
