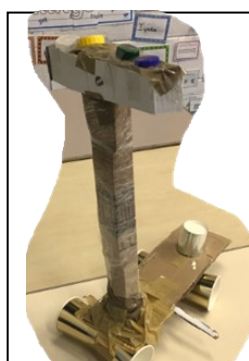
The heat wig 2000

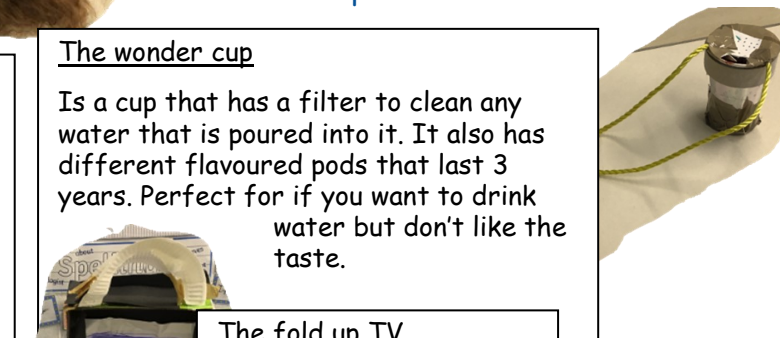
The Magic cup

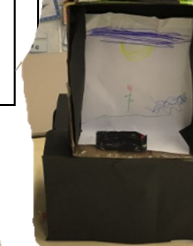
The wonder cup
