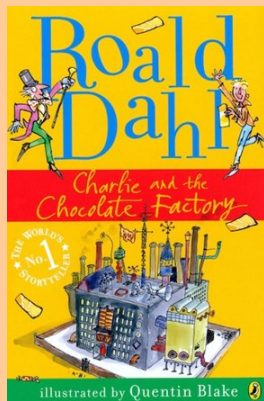
Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl – Book Review

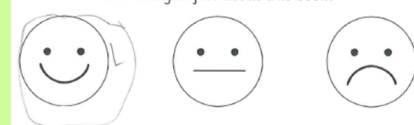

When I get the chance I like to play squash, football, and float on my kayak. I really like silly art and used to dress my babies up in funny ways when they were small - see one example below.



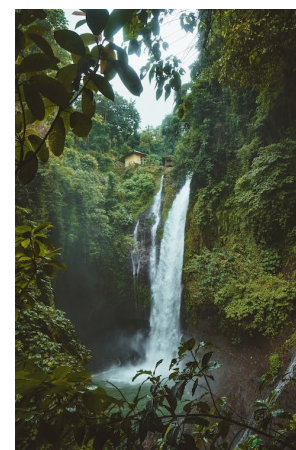
My role as governor

TROPICAL RAINFORESTS

The understory layer has lots of animals like birds and lizards. Not many animals live on the forest floor layer because it is so dark.
