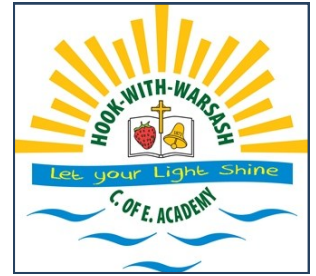


YEAR 2

CURRICULUM

SUMMER 2

Maths

In maths we will be focussing on recapping all of the main areas of maths we have looked at already including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

We will also be working on word problems– understanding what the question is asking us to do and approaches to working it out.

Fluency in using times tables where appropriate is another area we will be looking at.

R.E.

Our RE topic is Creation. We will be partaking in a range of different activities based around creation during our RE week.

English

We will be writing a story from the perspective of the pea from the story 'The pea and the princess', along with other books such as 'The Runaway Pea' and 'Supertato'

We will also be creating a castle fact file highlighting different types of castle, important parts of the castle structure and jobs that existed in a castle community.

Our writing will help us to practise all of our writing skills from this year.

Castles



Science

We will be returning to bulbs and seeds . We will also be recapping growing up, looking at the life cycle of a butterfly.

In our sustainability unit we will be learning about wildlife, what it can do for us and how we can protect it.

DT

We will be designing and making a salad concentrating on different preparation techniques, bringing some of our science healthy eating knowledge in to play.

History

This half term we are looking at castles. We will research why they were built, the different types of castles, jobs in the castle community and why castles became disused.

We will also be making our own castle models to explain what we have learnt.

Computing

We are going to be using the Scratch jr app with the aim of getting two sprites to interact with each other through programming. The children will be programming their sprites to tell 'knock knock' jokes to each other.

P.E.

We will be dancing for our PE this half term, both for the production and for the summer fair where we will be performing. We will also be practising our sports day activities.

PSHE and emotional well being

Our theme for this half term is 'Growing and changing'. Through the character of Harold we will be exploring changes that we go through as we grow up such as getting taller, feet getting bigger and being able to complete tasks we couldn't when we were younger. We will be discussing the importance of respecting the changes that happen to us as we grow up.

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
